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## COLLEGE OF LAW

The College of Law originates from the Department of Law which was established when the University was founded in 1946. It was part of the College of Political Science and Law, but the College of Law developed on its own in 1988. It has gained national recognition for its job-orientated legal teaching and scientific research. The College trains and educates students, who constitute one of the most esteemed groups in the university, to be lawyers, civil servants in high positions, and leading figures in public and private sectors. It has its own Law Library, a Legal Research Institute, and a Legal Aid Counseling Center to assist the faculty and students in their intensive studies and legal practices. The College confers the degree of Bachelor of Law to those who have completed the degree requirement successfully. Various internal and external scholarships are available for law students, and a modern dormitory (Hyong Seol Jae) is also provided for students studying for the Bar examination.

The College has a special relationship with the Law School of Santa Clara in the United States and has supported the Korean Law Program in Seoul for American students through sponsorship by the Law School since 1994.

### Courses

- **Seminar in special topics (2)**

This course has an objective to induce student's intellectual curiosity and activate their relationship through the face to face study method. It also helps to prepare the students for graduate course study. Different topics of social studies and different methods such as seminar, research, workshop, and field study will be used as announced by the professor.

### Basic Courses

- **General Parts of Civil Law (3)**

This course is a pre-requisite for all undergraduate students who want to ascertain a bachelor's degree in law. It provides a fundamental background which is vital

to a first year law student in Korea.

- **Constitutional Law I (3)**

Studying the fundamental theory of modern Constitutions and the basic rights of individuals in the Korean Constitution.

- **Criminal Law (3)**

This course is an introduction to the general theories applied with regard to crime and punishment of the Korean Penal Code.

- **General Parts of Obligation Law (3)**

Focusing on Property transactions with regard to real estate, this course is the second part of the civil code.

## DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC LAW

The purpose of the Department of Public Law is to train students to be lawyers and experts capable of managing public affairs in different fields. To this end, students with the knowledge of basic laws study further laws on public affairs such as government administration, tax and criminal cases.

### Major Courses

- **Constitutional Law II (3)**

This course concentrates on the general theory of separation and the inter-relationship of governmental powers and the power structure of the Korean government under the Korean Constitution.

- **Criminal Law (3)**

The study of offences and its legal ramifications provided in the Korean Penal Code and other relevant statutes.

- **History of Legal Thoughts (3)**

Historical review of legal interpretations from ancient to modern times and training students to develop a foundation for legal judgement.

- **Administrative Law (3)**

This course emphasizes the authority, and inter-relationships of public administrative organizations, as well as judicial relations between administrative organizations and citizens. It also focuses on the duties of public servants.

- **Economic Law (3)**

For a deeper understanding of the system of laws, the goals of which are aimed at solid capitalism, this course focuses on the regulation of monopoly and the Fair Trade Act and the Consumers' Protection Act.

- **Reading in Law in Foreign Language I (2)**

Students apply their English skills with respect to legal documents and text books.

- **Property Law (3)**

Focusing on property transactions with regard to real estate, this course is the second part of the civil code.

- **International Law I (3)**

This course discusses the basic theories of international law. The major topics are the sources of the law, the relationship between international law and domestic law, and the theories concerning the subjects of the law such as the United States, international organizations and individuals.

- **Comparative Constitutional Law (2)**

This course is a comparative study of democratized constitutions with respect to the Korean Constitution in relation to political parties, the election system, and the basic fundamental rights of individuals as well as the power of the government.

- **Administrative Law (3)**

According to the purposes and functions of administrative organizations, students receive an understanding of concrete administrative executions respectively in this course.

- **Education in Social Studies (2)**

The purpose of this Module is to educate the tutees as proficient teachers by theoretical research of text teaching and the on-the-spot practice based upon the clinical program at the university.

- **Texts and Teaching Methodology in Social Studies (2)**

The purpose of this Module is to educate the tutees as proficient teachers by theoretical research of text teaching and on-the-spot practice based upon the clinical program at the university.

- **International LawII (3)**

This course is designed to provide students with a sound knowledge of the law in specific fields such as laws of the sea, state responsibility, dispute settlement, armed conflict, and the environment, while introducing students to the complex array of problems and controversies which arise in these specific areas.

- **Criminology (3)**

While Studying the scientific theory of crime, this course focuses particularly on the causes and countermeasures for the re-socialization of criminals and the preservation of justice in society.

- **Social Security Law (2)**

Students learn the history and the scope of social security law as well as the situation and dilemmas that may arise within the four social insurance systems, i.e. industrial accident compensation insurance, medical insurance, national pension plans as well as employment insurance.

- **Unification and Law (2)**

This class discusses the impact of unification: North Korea, South Korea's conditions, and how the unification will affect both cultures. Further, this class analyzes how law will play the vital role in the unification process.

- **Seminar in Administrative Law (3)**

Application of basic theories learned in Administrative Law to practical cases in

accordance with precedent cases and the practical management of administrative law and its systematic theories.

- **Seminar in Criminal Law (3)**

Students will develop an integrated ability to apply and interpret the law and its theories on practical legal problems pursuant to criminal law.

- **Seminar in Constitutional Law (2)**

Applying discussion and analysis of hypothetical cases that may arise with respect to the constitution in comparison with real case verdicts of the Korean Constitutional Court.

- **Labor Law I (3)**

This course teaches students the basic rights of employees, trade unions, the collective bargaining system, and individual labor contracts of employment.

- **Information Law (3)**

The world is going to change from industry to technology. So, Information/ Telecommunication law is the new important part of law. Students learn what are the problems with this new law and what is the point of it in the IT field.

- **Seminar in Law of Criminal Procedures (3)**

The purpose of this Module is to raise the ability of students in applying law theories to various real cases through both the analysis & research of cases and case seminars relating to laws of criminal procedure.

- **Anglo-American Law (2)**

This course is designed to introduce students to the basic aspects and theories of the Anglo-American legal system, enabling students to expand legal knowledge on a comparative basis.

- **Seminar in International Law (3)**

The purpose of this course is to deepen students' knowledge on International Law by studying the important decisions of international tribunals.

- **Law of Criminal Procedure (3)**

This course covers an understanding of the general principles of current criminal proceedings and gives a survey of the criminal process which includes investigation, indictment, trials, and other pertinent situations.

- **Law of Local Autonomy (2)**

Study on legal fundamental theory and the system for effective application of local autonomy in localizational age.

- **North Korean Governmental Structure and Law (2)**

This module deals with the general political structure and laws of People's Republic of Korea. Especially the traits of Su-ryong(the Great Leader) System of PRK based upon Self-Determination(Juche) Ideology, the leadership of Chosun Labor Party, the relation between the above Party and the Government, Supreme Council of People's as one of political systems in PRK, Standing Committee of the above Council, the Cabinet, legal system of PRK, local government system in PRK will be the focus of this course in respect of their functions and roles.

- **Legal Clinic (2)**

Students of the Legal Clinic course participate in the consulting activities for the public or services to law-related social associations by applying their legal knowledge, thereby being acquainted with real life cases and service-oriented attitude.

- **Readings in Law in Foreign LanguageⅢ (2)**

Students apply their English skills with respect to legal documents and text books.

- **Special Topics on Law (2)**

Special area which does not taught in regular module or special issues of regular modules are being dealt with in this course.

- **Labor LawⅡ (3)**

This course teaches students the basic rights of employees, trade unions, the

collective bargaining system, and individual labor contracts of employment on a deeper level.

• **Case Studies of Public Law (2)**

Study on the process of applying local theory for the settlement of practical disputes through the analysis of Constitutional and Administrative law cases.

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## DEPARTMENT OF PRIVATE LAW

The purpose of the Department of Private Law is to train students to be lawyers and experts in economic sector. To this end, students with the knowledge of basic laws study further laws on private economic activities such as contracts between individuals, business transactions and international trade.

### Major Courses

- **Family Law (3)**

This course focuses on family relations and inheritance.

- **General Parts of Commercial Law (3)**

This course is to study the general principles of commercial law and surveys the general provisions of the Korean Commercial Code.

- **Sociology of Law (3)**

This course focuses on the sociological concepts, development, functions, and social change with respect to the law.

- **Contracts & Torts (3)**

This course is an introductory course on the laws which are applied with regard

to the obligation of contracts and torts with an emphasis on performance and solution.

- **Property Law (3)**

Focusing on property transactions with regard to real estate, this course is the second part of the civil code.

- **Corporatin Law (3)**

With a concentration on the principles of organizations and the operation of corporations this lecture emphasizes the application of the Commercial Code.

- **Legal Philosophy (3)**

Researches into the nature and substance of laws and justice as well as the theories of legal philosophy including laws of nature and legal positivism.

- **Education in Social Studies (2)**

The purpose of this Module is to educate the tutees as proficient teachers by theoretical research of text teaching and the on-the-spot practice based upon the clinical program at the university.

- **Texts and Teaching Methodology in Social Studies (2)**

The purpose of this Module is to educate the tutees as proficient teachers by theoretical research of text teaching and the on-the-spot practice based upon the clinical program at the university.

- **Law of Negotiable Instruments (3)**

Students get an understanding of the legal principles of the circulation of securities including the transactions of bills and cheques.

- **Taxation I (3)**

Students gain an understanding of the application of tax law and a synopsis of tax by applying fundamental principles of tax laws which are currently in usage with regard to its interpretation methods.

- **Law of Securities Regulation (3)**

The main focus of this module is to deal with the important issues of Laws of Securities Regulation through the study of specific types of transactions such as the basic structure of Securities market, M & A, the sell-off of the controlling interests.

- **International Trade Law (3)**

This course aims to offer a study on various legal issues relating to international commercial transactions, introducing students to the laws and institutions on international contract, international sale of goods, payment and finance for international trade, international carriage and insurance, and international commercial dispute resolution.

- **Intellectual Property Law (3)**

This course deals with the general views on intellectual property rights such as patents, designs, trademark and copy right infringement, and the unfair competition prevention law.

- **Conflicts of Law (3)**

Study on applicable laws in the case of the concurrence of state laws and practices of the acceptance of foreign judgements.

- **Seminar in Commercial Law (3)**

This lecture aims at developing the ability to solve actual legal problems through mock trials of Commercial Law.

- **Seminar in Civil Law (3)**

This course gives students the knowledge of how to apply the civil code to real case scenarios.

- **Civil Procedure I (3)**

This course examines the general rules and regulations of the civil code. It also examines the court system with respect to the parties involved, the legal fees involved in a suit, litigation proceedings, evidence, institution of suit, settlement

procedures, appeals, and final appeals.

- **Insurance & Maritime Law (3)**

Concentrating on Commercial Laws III and IV this course focuses on insurance and maritime law.

- **Taxation II (3)**

Students receive an understanding of the application of tax law and a synopsis of tax by applying the fundamental principles of tax laws which are currently in usage with regard to its interpretation methods.

- **Readings in Law in Foreign Language II (2)**

Students will develop the ability to read advanced legal documentation in English.

- **History of Legal System (2)**

This course gives students historical review of legal interpretations from ancient to modern times and train students to develop a foundation for a legal judgement.

- **Seminar in Civil Procedure (3)**

This module is approached through case research based upon basic knowledge and theory which have been raised through the lectures.

- **Civil Procedure II (3)**

Students will examine and apply the Civil Code to compulsory execution procedures.

- **Telecommunications Law (3)**

The world is going to change from the industry to technology. So, Information and Telecommunication law is the new part of important of law. In this course, students will learn what is the problem of this law and what is the point in the IT field.

- **Case Studies of Private Law (2)**

This module tries to teach the process in which the legal theory is applied to

the specific cases. This will be done through research into the important cases which have been decided in the Supreme Court of Korea.

- **Law & Finance (3)**

The focus of this course is on security transactions, factoring, project financing, and other legal institutions in relation to banking and finance.

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
