Duration of Study	The period of study will be one semester or one year, in accordance with the exchange program agreement between the two universities. The one-year students placed to the Center for Japanese Language and Culture (CJLC) in the first semester may be assigned to an upper-level class of the CJLC or a different department in the second semester.					
Requirements	(1) <u>CJLC classes</u> Students with an elementary level of Japanese and can communicate in English will be placed in the Center for Japanese Language and Culture (CJLC) and take classes offered by CJLC. The classes offered in English by some undergraduate-level departments of AGU may also be available.					
	(2) <u>Undergraduate-level classes</u> Students with the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) N2 or above (N1 for graduate students) may participate in undergraduate-level classes offered in Japanese, after completing an online interview in Japanese and receiving permission from professors. (Students are required to submit a JLPT certificate.) If students with N2 or above wish to study Japanese at the Center for Japanese Language and Culture (CJLC), they may also be allowed to attend CJLC classes with the permission of professors in charge.

Application Procedure	 The AGU Center for International Programs (CIP) receives email from the partner university with details of nominated student(s). An email response with AGU exchange application forms will be sent to the partner university. The nominated students must complete the application forms and send them back to AGU by email. The students must complete the application form for the Certificate of Eligibility (CoE) sent by AGU and return it to AGU by email. AGU applies to the Immigration Bureau for the issuance of a Certificate of Eligibility (CoE). After the CoE is issued, AGU will send the CoE with a confirmation of enrollment to the students. The students will then apply for a student visa at the Japanese embassy, consulate or equivalent institution.

Rent is about 21,500yen/month. Utilities are not included in the rent. (Cost subject to change without any notice. Commuting fees will separately be incurred.) Apartment near campus If there are no vacancies in the ISC, the CIP will arrange for an estate agent to find a room in a flat near the campus.			
Health Insurance	Every international student who lives in Japan for over three months is required to enroll in the National Health Insurance system. Subscribers to the system pay 30 percent of the medical expenses at a clinic or hospital for any medical and dental treatment covered by the system. (Insurance premium: about ¥2,000/month)
