2. Features of Exchange Student Program


Through this course, students will be able to have:

(1) Fukuoka Campus


Fukuoka is an international city of 1.5 million people that has been chosen as the Most Livable City in Asia by Asia Week magazine. Fukuoka Campus is located in Dazaifu to the south of Fukuoka City. Dazaifu flourished in the 7th century as a political center, and this ancient town is also renowned for Tenmangu, the shrine to the god of leaning, to which 650,000 visitors come each year. It is in addition home to large numbers of temples and shrines, and to the Kyusyu National Museum. The center of Dazaifu can be reached on foot from the campus, and from the campus it is a 15-minute train ride to the center of Fukuoka city itself.

(2) Tokyo Shibuya Campus



(2) English Studies Program

The Global Business Course conducted entirely in English to provide students with an international outlook and a firm grounding in subjects across the disciplines. JUE conducts over 50 classes in English and offers an increasing number of English-based programs. It will foster an atmosphere of global awareness and sensitivity among Japanese students.

8. Exam, Grades and Academic Transcript

(1) Exams and Grades

As a rule, first-semester exams are held in late July while second-semester exams are held in late January. Grades are generally announced every semester. There are five possible grades: S (90 points or higher), A (80 to 89 points), B (70 to 79 points), C (60 to 69 points), F (59 points or lower: Fail). A grade of C or better is required to earn credits from a course.

Note: Methods for evaluating student grades differ by school/graduate school.

After you complete your term of study, one (1) copy of your transcript in English will be sent to your home university.
